New Local Pastors beginning the Course of Study in the Revised Curriculum in 2015 should take 100 level courses first and must take the 500 courses last. 500 level courses are integrative, capstone and build on prior courses. 100 level courses provide introductory content to assist local pastors in successfully completing upper level courses. It is very helpful to take the Theology courses in order as the information builds from the preceding courses. 121 should be taken before other Bible Courses.
